

## REVOLUTIONS STORYBOOK PROJECT

Congratulations! Because of your class' incredible knowledge of revolutions, you have been hired by Talreja Publishers to create a children's book that teaches children (ages 7-10) about a revolution of your choice.

Choose a Revolution (Glorious Revolution, French Revolution, or Haitian Revolution) and turn the story of the revolution into a children's story with pictures or comics.

Each book must be a *minimum* of 10 pages. Each page must have a color picture or comic, and text that explains the events of the revolution. Use vocabulary that is appropriate for the age group, and be sure to clearly explain any advanced vocabulary you use. To ensure that no important details are accidentally left out, there is a list of terms that must be included in the storybook for each revolution. **However, do not limit yourself to these terms to complete the whole story.** Some lists are longer than others, but that does not make any revolution's book "harder" than another – in fact, it probably makes it easier because it is so specific.

Each student will need to have a rough draft and turn in the final book on the assigned days to receive full credit.
